

O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant!

Read this again, sing these words out this Christmas and be encouraged - there is real hope and life in these words because they reflect our own profound biblical truth!

The book of Isaiah from the Old Testament is unfamiliar to most. It was written more than 150 years before Christ and has an extraordinary story to tell, predicting God's plan for us with interesting detail.

A copy of the book of Isaiah was found in the Dead Sea Scrolls (1947-57), and these scrolls had copies of most books of the Old Testament. It's commonly understood that chapter 53 refers to the coming of Jesus Christ, and it predicts that he'll live among us and die for us because he loves us so much. His sacrifice will be our salvation and we can now have eternal life because of him. This is our good news, this is our good cheer, this is our light in the darkness this Christmas!

As we hunker down for another winter, there's a change of pace for many as we look forward to the season and the opportunity for festive gatherings. It is an opportunity for the community to draw together and be welcomed into the church, enjoying some of those seasonal services that hold such nostalgic memories. Christingles, Nine Lessons and Carols, Midnight Mass - whatever our understanding and wherever we've come from, we come again to engage with the gentle mystery of Christmas and the birth, the life and the meaning of Jesus Christ in our life. In these services there's always the opportunity to feed the soul, to find or perhaps rediscover the only spiritual truth that will lift and sustain us in this dark time.

Our curious minds are drawn to his light in this darkness, and perhaps to consider 'the god particle', the origin of all that exists. Scientists and theologians alike realise that, just as a particle of light can be in two places at the same time, so too is our God beyond the limitations of our physical universe, indeed beyond much of our human reasoning! However, of all things, we must remember that there is a divine eternal love for each one of us, beyond space and time, that will outlast whatever pain and anxiety this fallen world ever has for us. In this season of comfort and good cheer, we must rail against the darkness of this world and come again to that 'everlasting light' that 'in thy dark street shineth.'

As we slip into this new season with the singing of carols and the wistfulness of Christmas past, we must remember to draw deep from that rich hope that will never fade or perish. God is with us, he knows us and he has made 4

Volunteers Needed to Spread the Joy of Reading in Tiverton Schools



Children's literacy charity **Schoolreaders** is looking for more volunteers who can help spread the joy of reading to children in primary schools in Tiverton.

Every year, 1 in 4 children leave primary school unable to read to the expected standard.

Schoolreaders recruits volunteers to listen to children read in primary schools, focusing on schools where children require the most support. Volunteers are asked to listen to children read once a week in term time and to commit to an academic year.

95% of children supported by a Schoolreaders volunteer improve their reading age. Partner schools also reported that volunteers had a positive impact on pupils with 95% improving their reading confidence and 87% their reading enjoyment. Additionally, children benefit enormously from the volunteers as positive role models in the classroom.

Jane Whitbread, founder of Schoolreaders, comments, 'Children who leave primary school unable to read well can't access their secondary schooling fully which will compromise their life opportunities. One in seven adults in England (7.1 million) are functionally illiterate and cannot read instructions on a medicine label, sit a driving theory test or fill in a job application form. Working together we can change this.'

" Our Schoolreaders volunteers provide a crucial supplement to classroom teaching and are welcomed by schools and the children. If more children gain pleasure from reading from an early age and their reading fluency and confidence improves too, communities and society will reap the benefits."

Sheena, retired, and a Schoolreaders volunteer, explains her experience, *"For me, establishing a rapport with each child and recognising their uniqueness by making the sessions relevant and fun is what counts and the earlier we can do this the better.*

Ruth and Philip then moved on and stayed at a Hotel close to the Nile; we saw a beautiful photo of the African sunset. Kingfishers and swallows were seen in many places. After viewing the spectacular Sippy Falls Ruth and Phillip met Helen Fensome's sister, Liz, and her husband Paul and were driven to the School where they were greeted by a crowd of 135 smiling children, government dignitaries, clergy and the many local people present at this momentous occasion. At the school the children will be educated and older children learn skills for, life. There are still many problems as not all pupils can afford to pay and also more money is needed to pay for roof sheeting. After such a joyful day all were given candles to remember it by.

Ruth and Philip's day ended with a campfire in front of Liz and Paul's home. The last few days they spent visiting the Sissiya Falls and going on safari to see elephants, lions, antelopes, baboons etc.

Ruth summed up by saying they had a wonderful time and we all had a chance to view the numerous photos and pictures as we all shared tea and cake.

When the angel told Joseph that the baby Mary was expecting was the Son of God, he said, 'You will name him Jesus - because he will save his people from their sins' (Matthew 1.21). The name Jesus means 'God saves.' When the angel told the shepherds of the birth of Jesus, he said, 'This very day in David's town your Saviour was born - Christ the Lord!' (Luke 2.11).

Yet Jesus never called himself 'the Saviour,' and in the Gospels there are only three references to 'Saviour.' One of these is in the verse just referred to, and another is in the Magnificat, Mary's song of praise, where she sings, 'My soul is glad because of God my Sav-iour' (*Luke 1.47*). This second one continues the Old Testament cutom of applying the word as a title for God.

The third reference is in the story of Jesus meeting with the woman at the well of Sychar, in Samaria. After she had fetched the people from the town and they had invited Jesus to stay for a few days they said, 'It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Saviour of the world' (John 4.42).

Many of the 24 references to 'Saviour' in the New Testament also

use the word as a title for God. Of those that call Jesus 'Saviour' there are only two in the Acts of the Apostles (5.31, 13.23) and two in the letters of Paul (*Ephesians 5.23*, *Philippians 3.20*). Even though Paul often speaks of the saving work of Christ, he rarely calls him 'Saviour.'

All the other ten references occur in the letters that are acknowledged to be amongst the lat-est writings included in the New Testament. Once the name was accepted it became widely used, as we see in the later letters of the New Testament, and also in the second century letters of Ignatius, Polycarp and other writers. It is probable that the title 'Saviour' was avoided for many years because it was a title often applied to the Roman emperors. The title 'Saviour of the world' (which is John's description of Jesus [John 4.42, 1 John 4.14]) is especially common in inscriptions for Hadrian.

Once the title of 'Saviour' had become popular it remained so and with justification, for it is a fitting description for the one who saves us, not only from confusion, strife and sickness, as the emperors were supposed to have done, but from sin and guilt.

O Saviour of the world, who by your cross and precious blood has redeemed us, save us and help us we humbly beseech you.

Jam and Jerusalem

The recipe for December comes from The Very Revd Jonathan Greener, Dean of Exeter Cathedral. He gave it to us in his weekly sheet on all that's happening at The Cathedral, which I find very interesting. His wife made the Parmesan Biscuits for the farewell to Bishop Robert and many people asked for the recipe, so I'm sure the Dean and his wife will be very pleased that you are all given the opportunity to bake her Parmesan Biscuits too. They are ideal for your Christmas celebrations with a glass of wine!!!

Parmesan Biscuits Ingredients

250g salted butter - at room temperature, so soft

250g plain flour - sifted

250g Parmesan cheese or Grana Padano - finely grated

As you can see, it's equal quantities of all three ingredients, so you can simply scale up or down as you feel fit. I think this quantity makes between 60 and 80 biscuits.

Method

Take the butter and flour and mix as if you were creaming butter and sugar. Then add the cheese and mix again until a dough is produced.

Lay a sheet of cling film on a board or table, and spoon three or four blobs of dough in a line. Using the cling film, roll the dough into a thin sausage, about the diameter of a $\pounds 2$ coin,

Chill in the fridge for 20 minutes. Once the dough is firm, slice into discs about the thickness of the same $\pounds 2$ coin.

Spread the biscuits out on baking parchment on a baking tray (giving expansion room around each biscuit) and bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes until golden. We always set our fan oven at about 170°.

Remove and leave to cool on a wire cooling tray.

If you make multiple batches, you can readily re-use the baking parchment. Spare sausages in their cling film can be wrapped in foil and frozen. Defrost before cooking.

Cooked biscuits keep very well in an airtight container.

Delicious. Enjoy.

Not all sweetness and light

Running Lighthouse can sometimes throw up problems, as we have found during the last 35 years – is it really that long since New Creation first opened its doors? Perhaps the biggest problem we had to face was in the late 2010s when we were very close to closing down altogether. It was only by some very generous donations that we were able to move to our present premises and carry on as Lighthouse. For which we give all the glory to God and our thanks to those who helped us move.

Today, we are facing another problem – the café chairs. When setting up Lighthouse we bought chairs that were not quite up to the job and after only three years they need replacing. The observant amongst you may have noticed that we have swapped the white café chairs with the mustard chairs from downstairs, which have held up better. But it is only a temporary move.

Our problems pale into insignificance

But our problems pale into insignificance when we look at what is happening elsewhere in the world. Even in Tiverton we see people with housing, and other, problems, although CHAT does a wonderful work helping them. Looking further afield we see wars, fires, earthquakes, floods; all of which leave people suffering the loss of homes, work and loved ones.

For too long now our news has been filled night after night with first the war in Ukraine and now the conflict in the Middle East. And when those have not made the news, it is some other disaster. Our hearts and prayers go out to those people who are suffering – how would we cope in such situations?

And so we give thanks to God for how he has kept, first New Creation and now Lighthouse serving not only the people in our locality, but many visitors to Tiverton who are surprised and delighted to find a Christian book shop and café still open.

We give all the thanks and praise to

our Lord and Saviour that the only problem we face is how to source some replacement chairs.
