



Update on the Bells Project

Wow - You did it again! The November bellringers' coffee morning and Sunday craft sale raised an absolutely splendid total of over £1,000 for the bells project appeal. So, a big thank you to all who came and supported the events or gave donations despite not being able to attend. As a result, we have now raised over £16k towards our target of £25k. This includes a promised grant of £2,400 from the Devon Church Bell Restoration Fund.

The first phase of the tower work, the replacement of the wire mesh in the belfry

openings to keep birds out, was completed in the summer. An excellent job was done by local firms Morrish Engineering and Rapid Scaffolding and the photo shows part of the new mesh in place.

The other two phases of the work – to overhaul the bell bearings, clappers and wheels and to repaint the main bell frame – are due to start this month (January). As a result, our bells will be silent on Sundays and Tuesday evenings for 7 or 8 weeks until early March. During the silent period a team of volunteers will work to repaint the frame. We are hoping for weather that is not too cold or too damp to speed our work. If anyone who is reasonably fit can assist us for a few hours a week during this time, please let us know (name and phone to lesboyce@gmail.com).

Finally, we have started to make plans for the weekend of 23/24 March when we will celebrate the centenary of the bells. It was on 23rd March 1924 that the new bells were dedicated at a special service and heard for the first time. We plan to mark their 100 years with a special service, a celebration lunch, plenty of bell ringing and possibly a concert. We hope to make the celebration something the whole community can be part of. Please put the date in your diaries!


Jam and Jerusalem

Well Christmas has come and gone for another year, but maybe you will still have an excuse to make this lovely dish. It's what you might call my 'signature' dish and quite often use it when we have visitors, or not????

You can make it with left over chicken, turkey or you can use freshly cooked chicken breasts, & with the sauce you are guaranteed a lovely moist meal.

So.... this serves 4.

Approx 8 ozs frozen of fresh broccoli. 8 slices of cooked turkey or ??? Approx 12ozs. 1x 300g (10ozs)can of condensed Chicken soup. 2 tabsp lemon juice.



4 tabsp thick mayonnaise. Salt freshly ground black pepper.

1-2ozs fresh white breadcrumbs.

1-2ozs grated mature Cheddar cheese.

Cook the broccoli until only just cooked, and arrange in shallow overproduced dish.

Arrange the slices of turkey or ?? on top.

Combine the chicken soup, lemon juice, wine and mayonnaise, season well and pour over the turkey.

Mix the breadcrumbs with the cheese and sprinkle over the top.

Cook towards top of oven (200C.) 25-30 mins until bubbling and golden brown.

This is a very handy dish to have when entertaining as each stage can be done separately in advance, and just put together at the last minute.

Visiting other churches

'... this only do I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the Lord ... (Psalm 27:4)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is this month $(18^{th} - 25^{th})$ January), so it's probably a good time to meet with other local Christians – or at least to visit one of their churches.

And when visiting other churches, it's fun to have a good nose around.

Fewer churches seem to have guides nowadays, and probably not many are open every day. But when you next visit a church, why not look beyond the building itself and its monuments which show the history of the place? Try to discover *what is going on there now*.

First, ask yourself how easy it is to find out the following information:

- What are the services in the church, and when are they held?
- Who is who, and how do you contact people?
- Are the photos and notices up to date?

Secondly, is there a church magazine? They can be the lifeblood of the church and community, keeping people in touch with each other. Also, as church magazines can be delivered door to door each month, they are an excellent way of reaching out to local non-churchy people, reminding them that they will always be welcome.

Thirdly, why not keep an eye out for any good ideas that the church has got – and pinch them for our own church? This can work the other way, too – if you see something that does NOT work, make a note of that as well.

Above all, try and 'get a feeling' for what the church is really like to attend. Would you want to belong there? Some churches, like people, feel welcoming and alive, while sadly others seem to be struggling and downright gloomy. Whether it is 'high' or 'low' is not as important as whether it is welcoming and caring.

And what about our own church? How about inviting a non-church friend to come along and tell you their honest first impressions of our church? We might be pleasantly surprised!
