The Newte Library Reopening

The influence of the Newte family on our parish is profoundly visible, notably through several monuments in St Peter's church and the impressive organ commissioned by John Newte in 1696. John Newte's dedication to education and religion is evident in his numerous gifts, including a scholarship to Balliol College, Oxford for a Blundell's student and the establishment of a school for poor children in Cove. The library he founded is a surviving relic of his larger project to enhance the parish's religious and literate life.

At the end of last month, the library was officially reopened after the completion of the Seaton Gallery – a mezzanine floor to house the library above the office space with wonderful views across the Church. On display were notable items from the collection, including an illuminated book of hours, volumes relating to the Civil War and an early catalogue of the library. The West Gallery Quire from Crediton performed music from the period, including West Country tunes and a piece from the *The*



Royal Psalmodist Compleat by William Tans'ur, housed in the library;



and transporting the 100 plus visitors back to the 17th century.

The Newte library emerged during the turbulent 17th century, reflecting John Newte's support for the monarchy and high-church Anglican worship during times of political conflict. This library serves as a remarkable case study of local and national politics, and how individuals like Newte used print to bolster their causes. It can be interrogated both for its information on life in

the local area during the 17th and 18th centuries, and to examine the national charitable and religious movement that was gaining momentum in the early 18th century.

Parish libraries like this one offer rare insights into the reading habits of early modern English clergy. Unfortunately, many such libraries have been lost or neglected. However, this library is one of only four in Devon founded before 1800 with most of its collection intact, and the only one still housed in its parochial church.

The preservation of the library is an ongoing effort. Recent funding from the Idlewild Trust and Church Buildings Council have enabled us to restore the 17th-century portraits which hang on the screen in front of the library. Conservation work on the books will begin in the Autumn and any funds towards this are gratefully received.

A huge thank you to everyone who has contributed to the reopening event, from those who volunteered on the day to the caterers and bellringers, and to those who helped behind the scenes. A number of individuals have asked if I would publish more on the library so over the coming months I hope to highlight an item in the collection in more detail.

TIVERTON **I IFFPATH** 2024



Fiverton Lifepath 2024

LIFEPATH was originally a Scripture Union resource which is run by local churches all across the UK. It aims to give primary school pupils the opportunity to explore the 'life path' of an historic Christian who had connections with their own locality, and to use this as a springboard to reflect on their own 'life path'.

Lifepath Tiverton focuses on the Wesley family, of whom, Samuel Wesley (1690-1739) was



the headmaster at Old Blundell's (1734-1739).

Year 4 children come from schools in the area to spend a day at St Paul's church. Together with accompanying school staff and a Wesley child (a volunteer adult), each group of about 10 children takes part in 4 activities, exploring the lives of various members of the Wesley family. Lunch is a 'bring-yourown' picnic, hopefully outside the church if it's dry!

Following Scripture Union's Lifepath guidelines the day begins


and ends with collective gathering, which includes some dramatisation of the Wesley family history. Everyone has some space during the day for reflection on their own 'inner journey'.

In June 2024, several volunteers from St Peter's joined the Tiverton Lifepath team and one of the Newte Library books was used at the event. The children were 'wowed' particularly by the antiquity of such a volume.

Here's another lovely recipe from Jo Hall-Tomkin, and very easy to make, so will soon become a favourite I'm sure.

Chocolate and Brandy Pots.

Serves 4-6 1 pint of single cream 1 large (200g) bar of good quality dark chocolate. (Cadbury's Bourneville will do) 2 eggs 2 tablespoons brandy (or tea sp. Brandy essence)



Break up the chocolate into small squares and put into small heatproof bowl. Add all the single cream.

Heat gently together, stirring, either over a pan of simmering water or in the microwave, until it comes to a rolling boil. Stir well together until completely smooth.

Meanwhile, whisk together eggs and brandy, then pour into chocolate and cream mixture, whisking together until completely amalgamated.

Pour into ramekin or sundae dishes, and leave to set in a cool place.

Serve with single or whipped cream.
