

Celebrating the birth of our Saviour and friend.

Christmas is a time of drawing ourselves around the gospel and taking a moment to wrestle with what's been done for us, so let's be clear about this gospel message and the good news. The Gospel is not that Jesus Christ comes to earth, tells us how to live, we live a good life and then God owes us blessing. No - The Gospel is that Jesus Christ came to earth, lived the life we should have lived and died the death we should have died, so when we believe in Him we live a life of grateful joy for Him. Because this is true, the Christmas story has life and meaning!

If Jesus didn't come, the story of Christmas is just a moral judgment to burden us, trying to keep us in check with rules on true love, humility and sacrifice. The 'take out' from that would simply crush us because if it isn't true that John saw Him, heard Him, felt Him, that Jesus really came to do these things, then Christmas is simply depressing. It would be just too big a burden for us to carry with all the rest of our brokenness.

John's first letter says that our fellowship is with the Father and with his son. 'Fellowship' means that if Jesus Christ has come and Christmas is true, then we've got a basis for a personal relationship with God. God is no longer a remote being to be fearful of, but we can come to know Him personally. He has become graspable! If Jesus Christ is actually God come in the flesh then we are going to know a lot more about God. We see Him angry, upset, weeping, cast down and finally and wonderfully we see Him rightly exalted. Our understanding is more personal and specific than any other philosophy or religion can claim with Jesus telling us He is who He says He is, we have a valuable piece of God's autobiography.

We can marvel at what God has done to get us to know Him personally. If God's Son has come all this way to become a real person, we can rest assured that God's Holy Spirit will do everything possible to make Jesus real to us in our heart.

So let's celebrate again - Christmas is a time to know Christ personally. Christmas is an invitation by God to say, 'Look what I've done to come near to you. Now draw near to me because I want to be a friend.' Thankfully and wonderfully, the confidence and the reassurance that we can remember at this time of year.


Treasures from the Newte Library

The library was one of many gifts and bequests by John Newte which centred around education and strived to improve the religious and literate life of the parish. In addition to the library, one of John Newte's great achievements was raising the money for the organ at St Peter's, which is still in use today. The organ was built by Christian Smith, nephew and pupil of Bernard Smith who built the organ for Christopher Wren at St Paul's Cathedral in London. There was strong opposition from the Puritan contingent in the town, but Newte refuted their objections and conducted a long campaign to have the organ installed. On 13th September 1696 when the organ was first used, Newte preached a sermon titled 'On the Lawfulness and Use of organs in the Christian Church'. A published version is housed within the library.

In his sermon Newte speaks out strongly against the period of unrest during the Civil War when the use of music in churches was 'sacriligiously discontinued' and criticises those who removed music from church services. The Civil War had a profound effect on John and his father, Richard, who, in 1654, was finally ejected from his position as Rector of the Tidcombe and Clare portions of Tiverton for his royalist leanings and for providing a sermon on Christmas day, at that time a banned festival.

John Newte believed that organ music would improve devotion and 'regulate the untunable voices of the multitude and make the singing in church more orderly and harmonious'. The copy of the sermon contained in the library is a second edition, indicating the subject matter was one which provoked interest for a number of years, both locally and further afield.

His sermon came under criticism from Puritan groups and four years later in 1700, Henry Dodwell, a contemporary and acquaintance of Newte, published a treatise answering these attacks. John Newte wrote the preface for



Dodwell's treatise. He ends the preface with 'since the late erection of the Organ...and much by the means of it, we have a Regular and decent, and I hope as Devout a Congregation as any in the whole Diocese'.

A Busy Year for the Bellringers

By the time you read this the ringers will have held their tower AGM and taken the opportunity to review the year that has passed. And what a year! We celebrated the centenary of our present bells, the 150th anniversary of our Guild of Devonshire Ringers and completed a major restoration project – all while keeping our Sunday ringing and our weekly practices and teaching sessions going and ringing for special occasions.

Since the last AGM, as well as regular practices and Sunday service ringing, we rang for the following special events:- Robert Gordon's Funeral in November and another funeral in August, New Year's Eve, A Peal for the Centenary & 150 years of the Guild, Ring out for Peace, and Quarter Peals for Bell Sunday (May), St Peter's Day (June), the Newte Library opening (September) and for Evensong October). We also ran a Coffee Morning, won the St Peter's Shield Competition, entered a team for the Guild 6 Bell Novice competition and many of the band took part in the Guild Festival Fortnight, ringing throughout the Branch. We also raised funds through craft work during the year to boost the funds for work on the bells and organised further events to raise funds and celebrate the centenary.

Throughout the year a large team of ringers, family and friends have helped at the fundraising events, worked in the tower with the bellhanger in January and March and slogged through to the end of September to get all the iron and steelwork painted in the tower. It was therefore with some relief that when the Guild's Bell Adviser came to inspect the work at the end of October, he had no hesitation in recommending that we should receive the promised grant of £2,400 from the Devon Church Bell Restoration Fund. The transfer of that money to St Peter's marks the end of our project and the culmination of a magnificent volunteer effort. Over 700 hours of volunteer time was given to the project work in the tower which saved St Peter's £9,350 of additional cost. Over £20,000 was raised through events and donations. At least the same number of volunteer hours was spent in addition producing items for sale to raise money.

Sheila began her report for the Ringers' AGM with these words:

I would like to start by thanking you all for your added commitment during the last 12 months. We have had a very busy year with the Centenary celebrations after all the work on the bells. You have all given above and beyond what is normal for bellringing volunteers.

Lastly, we should record a big thank you to the Church congregation and PCC and all who have supported us in our work. The pictures which follow remind us of just how much was done in the year – and how much enjoyment we got from the experience.

Scripture Cake Recipe

Recipe Ingredients:

- 1) 200g ... Judges v:25 ... last clause
- 2) 250g ... Jeremiah vi:20
- 3) 3 tbsp ... I Samuel xiv:25
- 4) 4 of ... Jeremiah xvii:11
- 5) 170g ... I Samuel xxx:12 ... second food
- 6) 170g ... Nahum iii:12
- 7) 100g ... Numbers xvii:8
- 8) 500g ... I Kings iv:22
- 9) 1 tsp ... II Chronicles ix:9
- 10) 1 tsp ... Leviticus ii:13
- 11) 2 tsp ... Amos iv:5
- 12) 5 tbsp ... Judges iv:19 ... last clause

Recipe Method:

Grease a cake tin lightly with butter and line it with some baking parchment. The baking parchment will help stop the top of the cake burning or drying out too much, allowing the cake to be baked for a longer time at a lower temperature.

Chop up Nahum iii (ingredient 6) fine.

Blanch and chop up Numbers xvii (ingredient 7) fine – if they have not been already bought like this.

In one large mixing bowl cream together Judges v, Jeremiah vi, and I Samuel xiv (ingredients 1, 2 & 3) – add Jeremiah vi (ingredient 4) one at a time – still beating.

Add into this bowl, I Samuel xxx, Nahum iii, and only half of Numbers xvii (ingredients 5, 6 & 7) next and beat again until everything is fully mixed.

In another, larger mixing bowl, sift together I Kings iv, II Chronicles ix, Leviticus ii, and Amos iv (ingredients 8, 9, 10 & 11). Make a well in the centre of the ingredients.

Add the first mixing bowl ingredients into the well in the centre of the second mixing bowl, (wet ingredients into the dry ingredients). Stir until a cake batter starts to form.

Lastly add enough of Judges iv (ingredient 12) in to the cake batter so

that it becomes easy to mix and is of a 'dropping' consistency, i.e. the mixture will easily drop off the mixing spoon. You might need some extra Judges iv if the mixture is a little dry. Stir to thoroughly combine the cake mixture and then pour it into the prepared cake tin.

After pouring the cake batter into the cake tin sprinkle over the top the remaining half of Numbers xvii (ingredient 7) and gently press them part way into the batter.

Bake the Scripture Cake at 160C for 1 -1/2 hours, (90 minutes) or until done, test by pushing a skewer into the centre of the cake and see if it comes out clean.

A Scripture Cake can last for several days in an air tight tin and some people say they actually improve in flavour if baked on one day and eaten on the next.

Seeing AI is a free app that narrates the world available to all but a great help for blind and low vision people, on a mobile device to hand.


